QUEEN'S COMMONWEALTH ESSAY

The Queen's Commonwealth Essay Competition is the world's oldest schools' international writing competition, managed by The Royal Commonwealth Society since 1883. Every year, it offers all Commonwealth youth aged 18 and under the opportunity to express their hopes for the future, opinions of the present, and thoughts on the past. In 2019, 11,000 young people from across the Commonwealth entered the Competition. This year's competition, on the theme 'A Connected Commonwealth' asked entrants to consider how they can work to use cultural, technological and environmental connections for positive change across the Commonwealth. RAISING & EDUCATING GEN Z

A seminar was held to discuss the challenges parents and educators face in raising Generation Z (Gen Z) - children born after the internet came into existence. Some issues identified include:

- ◆ Boredom with traditional classes and subjects
- ◆ Mental stress caused by cyber bullying or other pressures from increased social media interactions
- ◆ Gen Z are somewhat disconnected with the older generation, parents and teachers alike
- ◆ Addiction to their gadgets like mobiles or ipads
- ◆ Excessive amount of time spend on social media
- ◆ Drop in fitness in Gen Z due to hours spend indoors as well as unhealthy eating habits

In order to engage this generation better, we are bringing about changes in classroom practices as well as focusing on mental wellbeing and leadership development.

- ◆ Flip Learning to motivate students by giving them ownership of their learning
- ◆ Increasing use of technology in classrooms
- ◆ Workshops and awareness campaigns on issues such as child protection, bullying or happiness
- ◆ Counsellors at each campus with an open-door policy to be available for students
- ◆ Team activities and challenges, outward bound, trek, conference and travel opportunities
- ◆ Focus on values and personal development
- ◆ Focus on developing empathy through service
